You will need a 2017 State Park vehicle sticker (annual \$28; daily \$8) and a State Trail Pass (annual \$25; daily \$5) per person. These can be purchased at the Lapham Peak entrance station. Lines can be long at the entrance station so come early. Lapham Peak is one mile south of I-94 on County Highway C at the Delafield exit.

If there is snow, Wheel & Sprocket provides ski rentals on Saturdays from 9 am to 9 pm in the small white building on the road to the Evergreen Shelter area. Call the Delafield store at 262-646-6300 for prices. The store opens at 10 am on Saturday.

Ski the Nordic Trail in Southern Kettle

Sunday, January 29th, 1:00 pm

Dave Harrison, the second president of the Nordic Ski Club of Milwaukee, designed the Nordic Trail, a cross-country ski trail named after our club. Located in the forested, rolling hills of the Southern Unit of the Kettle Moraine State Forest, the Nordic Trail caters to a variety of skill levels.

Meet other club members at 1 p.m. on Sunday, Jan. 29. In the heated lodge, you can find people to ski with and discuss trail conditions. Bring your camera as the pine trees and scenery are lovely. This well-marked system of cross-country ski trails has been refined since Dave first created it.

The trail system is an hour's drive from Milwaukee. The nearby store at LaGrange is worth a stop for homemade food, supplies and "quaintness." It usually rents skis.

If the snow is better at another location, we will go there; if no snow, we'll hike but possibly at another place.

Please call Paula Brookmire at (414) 527-0040 Saturday evening or between 9 and 11 a.m. Sunday to confirm the ski or hike location. Also, let her know if you are coming and if you want to carpool (11:50 a.m.) or meet us there at 1 p.m.

Notes: A Wisconsin state park sticker for the car and a state trail pass for each skier are required.
