Delicious and authentic German food is available at Oktoberfest. Dinners of broiled chicken, Oktoberfest bratwurst or spanferkel (young pig spit roasted over an open pit), include potato salad, coleslaw and bread. Rollbraten (sliced pork roast on a Kaiser roll), hot dogs, pretzels and sweet roasted almonds are available. Desserts include fruit strudel, tortes and assorted homemade cakes. Get in line early for your Bienenstich or "Bee sting" cake. Of course there's plenty of beer on tap imported and domestic as well as other drinks. There are traditional German imported gifts and souvenirs sold at the park as well. The main festivities take place in the Bavarian Fest Garten - an Alpine style pavilion equipped with weather curtains on the open sides. Check it out at The Bavarian Bierhaus. Click on the Octoberfest link in the upper right corner for details, pictures, etc.

Two tables have been reserved for us in the covered Octoberfest pavilion, so we can enjoy the festivities regardless of the weather. We must occupy the tables by 6 pm. **HOW DO I GET THERE**: you can call me for directions Julie Amundson: <u>262-567-4531</u>, car pool with a friend, or look up directions in the <u>Club Ski Trail Info</u>.

**WHY**: Scuppernong is a beautiful set of hiking trails located in the Southern Kettle Moraine. At this time of year, the trees will begin their fall colors. There are three primary loops of trails: 2.3, 4.2, and 5 mile distances. You can hike all or part of a trail, combine portions of loops to achieve the distance of your choice. The primarily intermediate rolling terrain offers a trail for everyone.
