The Kegel children have formed the Chris Kegel Fund to promote bicycling. On Oct. 20, Amelia Kegel will speak to the Nordic Ski Club of Milwaukee about the state of bicycling, the Kegel Fund, and the possible revival of her father's favorite ride, SAAGBRAW, which went across Wisconsin. She'll also address what's new in cross-country ski gear. At this meeting, the Nordic Ski Club will present a check for \$300 to Amelia for the Kegel Fund. The money was part of the club's fundraising effort last winter and spring to support skiing and biking. available on the club website and were in a September email sent to members. Don't mail in reservation forms if you plan to sign up at the in-person registration.

To prepare your registration, complete the reservation form for each ski trip and include a separate check payable to NSCM for the deposit amount. If you do not select the option to have the "trip letter" emailed to you several weeks before departure, please enclose a self-addressed, stamped, business-size envelope (9 1/2" x 4 1/8") with each reservation. Note that "four-to-a-room" means that there are four people and two beds in a room, with two people sharing each bed.

At the October in-person registration and meeting, one member of a household membership can bring all the reservation forms for their household. You can bring reservation forms for others who cannot attend the meeting, but please note the signup priority: 1st) Current Program Committee members, Board of Directors members, and ski-trip leaders. 2nd) People physically present at the October meeting on a first-come, first-served basis. 3rd) Reservation forms brought to the meeting for individuals not present in the signup line, as well as those reservation forms received by the ski-trip leader no later than the day prior to the October meeting, will be placed in a random drawing for that trip's open slots. 4th) Mailed reservation forms arriving on or after the October meeting date and online reservations.

Online ski-trip registration opens on Saturday, October 21. Online PayPal reservations require payment of the total amount. Online registration is generally available until one week prior to the departure date or until the trip fills. Save time, paper, postage, and gas---sign up online!

Save Money! Sign up Early for Ski Trips

Save \$20 on any of this year's Wisconsin/Upper Michigan cross-country ski trips. Just sign up at least 30 days before the start of each trip. The Nordic Ski Club of Milwaukee wants to make it easier for both trip participants and trip leaders to plan and to avoid having to cancel a trip at the last minute. Worried about losing your large trip payment if you have to cancel? We have a solution.

In the past, we charged any unrecoverable costs or a minimum \$10 cancellation fee. In a few cases, people lost much of the trip cost. Starting this year on a trial basis, the maximum cancellation fee will be \$60. So if you cancelled a trip and there were \$30 in unrecoverable costs, you would lose \$30. But if you cancelled a trip and there were \$100 in unrecoverable costs, you would only lose \$60. So please help us out by signing up at the early price. This way trip leaders won't have to send out their ski trip letters multiple times and they can complete a rooming list early enough to meet the lodge's requirements.

We'll email all club members five days before the \$20 savings deadline for each ski trip. But we encourage you to sign up even sooner, preferably at the Oct. 20 club meeting. - **NEW! Save \$20 if registering at least 30 days** before the ski trip departure date. Signup early to save money.

- **NEW! Maximum \$60 fee for canceling a ski trip registration.** Pay the non-recoverable costs up to \$60, with the minimum cancellation fee remaining at \$10. Cap your potential risk when registering for a ski trip.

- **First opportunity to register for ski trips is Friday, October 20** at Greenfield Park Pavilion. Online registration begins Saturday, October 21.

Start your autumn weekend with some music! Come hear Lake Cottage Duo, which is NSCM member Juanita Becker (pianist) and oboist Sheri Mattson, on Friday, October 6 at 5:00 pm for a "First Fridays at Five" concert at Grace Lutheran Church, 1209 North Broadway in downtown Milwaukee, at Juneau Avenue. Admission is free and a freewill offering will be taken. The concert will last about an hour. Street parking is metered until 6 pm.

The concert features music for oboe and piano by Antonio Vivaldi, Gordon Jacob, Dutch composer Henk Badings (this work is on the duo's CD), and Emma Lou Diemer. In addition, Juanita will play six solo piano preludes by the Dutch woman composer, Henriëtte Bosmans.

Lake Cottage Duo has performed at Milwaukee Art Museum, Ironwood Theatre, colleges and universities, and "Sunday Afternoon Live from the Chazen" on Wisconsin Public Radio. In 2015, after performing in Sweden at an international music conference, the duo gave a private concert at the residence of the Danish ambassador to Helsinki, Finland. Juanita is Associate Professor of Music at Wisconsin Lutheran College and has published a biography of Henriëtte Bosmans. Sheri is a native of Ironwood, Michigan (the home of ABR Trails) and is Professor of Oboe at the University of Central Missouri.
